

#### **Melody Z Wins Division at the Bentonville Marathon**




Melody Zechiedrich is a long-time marathon runner and did very well on April 7 at the Bentonville Half-Marathon. As a busy mother of three with little time for training, she placed 1st out of 183 females in her age division, 22nd out of 954 total females, and 151st out of 1893 total

She tore her ACL again one year later and opted not to have a second surgery. 
determination and work ethic in all aspects of her life!!





Any way you slice it, a 919 Hybrid built out of LEGO is cool. But it's even cooler that LEGO has two different designs. Let's compare the two.

Aside from a simple livery change, LEGO went the extra mile to make sure their new design is appropriately different enough to match last year's design. There is a bit of similarity between the two designs, but clearly a lot changed between 2015 and 2017. The front fenders of the 2015 design are much more narrow and upright, as they were in the real-life car as well. For 2017, Porsche laid back their fenders and brought the front of the car more level, and drastically widened the front headlights. The sides of the 2017 model are much more shapely as well, curving inward with delicate aero strakes, while the 2015 car is more slab-sided.





# Tech Tips

#### **How Dost Your Wheels Look?**

Parade is coming up and we want to look sharp right!? Not you, your Porsche. Most of the time I use the car wash soap when washing the Boxster to clean the wheels and while it does okay you generally spend a lot of effort just smearing the brake dust around. Using a dedicated wheel cleaner makes cleaning wheels much quicker and tends to get in the wheels' crevices

better. There are multiple wheel cleaners out there but read the warnings on the back. If it says skin irritant, keep away from small children and pets, etc you generally don't want to use it because it will play havoc on the wheels' clear coat.



Look for "acid free" or "pH balanced". A good one is Sonax (that's what I use). It can be ordered from Wally World at \$15.99. Porsche has a wheel cleaning kit for \$80. If you want to cross over to the dark side, BMW has a great cleaner for about half the cost of Sonax but it doesn't turn red. Jay Leno has come out with a new line of car care products. You can't go wrong with Griot's.

In order to get a really clean wheel, you gotta take the wheel off. I only do this a couple of times a year but when I am done they look like new and is time well spent. A big caveat is that cleaners should be applied to cooled off wheels. You can forget trying to get the brake dust off your wheels when you just came off a 15 minute hot lap session at Hallett.

Spray the wheel cleaner directly on the wheel inside and outside then let it sit

for up to 5 minutes. Afterwards rinse it off with water. Sonax sprays on as green foam and turns red as dirt and grime are penetrated. I found that simply adding a little effort with a wheel cleaning brush (especially mounted to an electric drill)




yields a much cleaner wheel and uses far less cleaner in the process. The front wheels have the most brake dust exposure but all four wheels have lots of difficult areas which can be a PITA to clean. When scrubbing with the brush the wheel cleaner gets incredibly foamy, Waiting the prescribed 5

minutes to do its magic seems like an eternity when one wants to get going on cleaning the car but take your time. The foaming action lifts away the brake dust. When the wheel is rinsed and dried it will look really good, though on close inspection it will still reveal some areas where stubborn brake dust remains. A good firm toothbrush helps here.

When going to the trouble to remove the set of wheels, throw some metal polish and/or wax on the wheels. There is wax advertised specifically for wheels but just use what you got. Wax helps keep the brake dust from sticking and in addition it "cleans, restores and protects" the wheel's finish. Apply a light coat, let it dry to a haze and then buff off. Metal polish is good for non-clear coated wheels. Just make sure you know your wheel's composition; alloy, aluminum, steel, painted, unpainted, etc.

Remount the wheels and stand back to admire your handiwork. Don't forget to clean your tires too but that's a story for another day.





