Probably one of the biggest thrills I got when driving my 996 was shifting gears. The run up on the tach hitting 5000 to 5500 rpm or higher, pushing or pulling to the next gear then repeating was a symphony only a classical music orchestra could improve on. I seriously believe the flat six could be considered a musical instrument. So why did I buy a Cayman with a Tiptronic transmission? Well, for one, it was available at the right price, and two, I thought I would just do as I was doing in the BMW, switch to manual and move the stick back and forth. Problem solved.

Imagine my surprise and frustration when I realized the stick doesn't move when switched to manual. You might as well have a sweet potato sitting on your console. Shifting had been moved to the steering wheel in the form of chrome buttons labeled + or -. I no like. The good God in heaven made humans different from other mammals by giving us opposing thumbs and a higher level of consciousness although the latter could be debated. But I seriously don't think He had in mind when putting out the inspiration for Porsches that it should be shifted with a thumb. It ain't natural although I'm sure the 991/992 owners with their shiny PDK levers and what looks like a key fob sitting in their console instead of a righteous stick would disagree with me. At least my Cayman has a stick for PRND duties. Yay me.

I do have a problem shifting with my thumbs. The Tiptronic is not properly valved for performance shifting in automatic mode but rather leaning toward economy driving unless you push the throttle 3/4 to the floor. It starts out in second gear and climbs to fifth in like three seconds. So when driving through 62 to Eureka Springs, I switch to manual. I don't know if it's a hand/eye coordination thing or what but I get all fumble-fingered when determining my shift points by engine sound. Porsche, in their wisdom, did put electronic controls to keep from over-revving or bogging down. My next Porsche will be a manual but then will I still want one as I climb in years or want the luxury of auto-shifting. Who knows?!!!

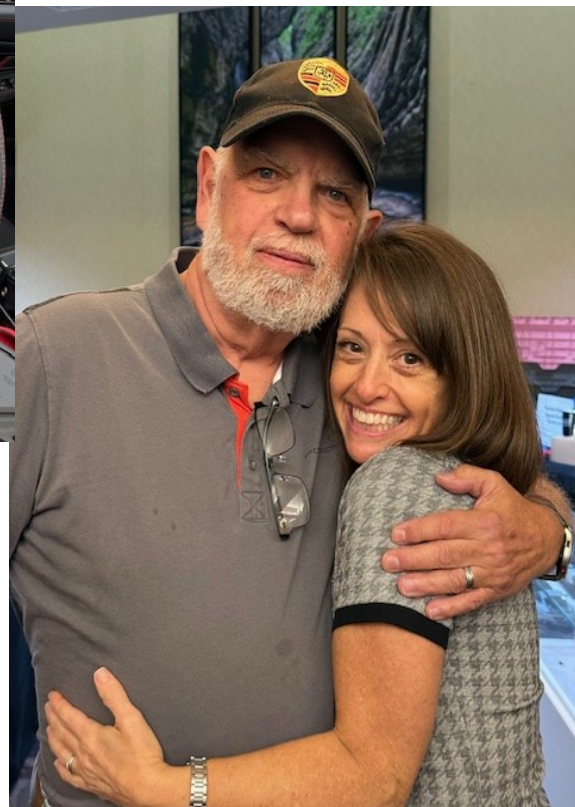

Ok. Well, maybe just a little bull, but it's so little you will barely notice it on the **GIANT** Cadillac.



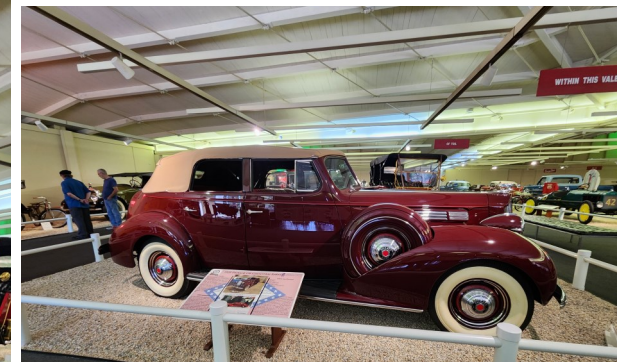
And GREAT SCOTT! You don't even have to time travel to get there.

New PCM feature: YouTube integration in four further model lines

Even more convenient media enjoyment in PCM: YouTube is now included as standard in all Porsche 911, Cayenne, Panamera and Taycan models that support in-car video. The video platform enhances the driving experience, especially on longer journeys.



Porsche is expanding the entertainment options offered by Porsche Communication Management (PCM) in four further model lines. YouTube, the world's most-used video platform, is now available as standard in the 911, Taycan, Cayenne and Panamera, following its successful launch in the all-electric Macan. In newly configured vehicles, users have access to the video portal from the moment they take delivery of their vehicle. Existing vehicles that have already been delivered and have in-car video functionality can be retrofitted free of charge via a software update.

Porsche is thus offering its customers access to YouTube in its vehicles. Depending on the model series and equipment, streaming is possible for the front passenger either while driving or during driving breaks.

YouTube is seamlessly integrated into the PCM via the in-car video function.

YouTube offers an almost inexhaustible range of entertainment and educational content. This means that travellers can get inspiration for a stop-over along the way, for example at a place of interest or a restaurant along the route. Those who prefer a dynamic detour can access tips on inspiring routes. The portal also contains helpful videos to help understand the functions of Porsche vehicles, for example Porsche's own tutorial series 'Spot on'. YouTube also offers direct access to weather reports, news and other information on current events in the local area. The streaming service is not just for entertainment. Rather, it provides another almost unlimited source of knowledge directly in the PCM. YouTube works free of charge in the PCM with no prior registration. After optional login with a personal YouTube account, users can directly access individual recommendations, subscribed channels or stored favourites.

All compatible Porsche models play YouTube content on the central display of the PCM when the car is stationary. This makes productive and entertaining use of charging breaks in electrically powered vehicles. A passenger display is optionally available for the Cayenne, Panamera and Taycan model lines. It is designed so that it cannot be seen from the driver's seat and does not distract the driver. This means that passengers can also enjoy YouTube content while the car is in motion. This comprehensive entertainment system makes long journeys in two- and four-door Porsche sports cars even more entertaining. The Porsche becomes a mobile multimedia hub.

Porsche Motorsport and Iron Dames launch far-reaching partnership

“Porsche X Iron Dames – because every dream matters” is a slogan that represents the close collaboration between Porsche Motorsport and the renowned initiative to promote women in motor racing. The project kicks off with the start of the Asian Le Mans Series next weekend in Sepang (Malaysia).



Four fast female drivers will compete in four top series at the wheel of a Porsche 911 GT3 R. Michelle Gattling from Denmark, Rahel Frey from Switzerland, Sarah Bovy from Belgium and Célia Martin from France will race for the Iron Dames squad in Asia, Europe and the USA. The schedule also includes the 24 Hours of Le Mans as part of the FIA World Endurance Championship WEC.

Gattling, Frey and Martin will share driving duties in the pink 911 in the LMGT3 class of the FIA WEC. The Manthey team is responsible for the operational side of campaigning the ca. 416 kW (565 PS) racing car powered by a flat-six engine. The seasoned customer squad lifted every title in the GT3 category's debut season in the WEC. Proton Competition runs operations in the Asian Le Mans Series, the European Le Mans Series and the North American IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. As part of this, Michelle Gattling from Denmark will be promoted to the Porsche contracted driver squad.

The alliance between Porsche Motorsport and Iron Dames is set to continue for several years. Plans are already in the pipeline for the project to be closely linked to the German sports car manufacturer's successful junior development pyramid. The aim is to interlink the national support programs in the Porsche one-make cups, the central Junior Program of Porsche Motorsport and the recently introduced “Iron Dames Young Talents” initiative. Ideally, this creates a path for young talents from karting to top professional sport.

“Porsche stands for a culture of equal opportunities and diversity. Encouraging women to get involved in motorsport and then supporting them in open competition is something we value highly. In this context, we've seen that the Iron Dames project is well-structured and was very successful in recent years,” explains Thomas Laudenbach, Vice President Porsche Motorsport. “Since our customer teams have already celebrated victories with the Iron Dames, we're now taking the next logical step. We're very confident that the collaboration in all series will reap excellent results and we can highlight our contribution to supporting female racing drivers with victories and podium finishes.”

In recent years, Porsche customer teams have already enjoyed successful outings with the Iron Dames. In 2023, Gattling, Frey and Bovy celebrated a milestone at the wheel of the Porsche 911 RSR at the season finale in Bahrain, where they were the first female trio to clinch a class win in the World Endurance Championship. Last season, the three racing drivers jointly won the LMGT3 class of the 4-hour race of the European Le Mans Series in Imola (Italy). Last month, Spaniard Marta García completed a successful test in the Porsche 99X Electric of the TAG Heuer Porsche Formula E Team. The 24-year-old is part of the Iron Dames' sponsorship programme.

Tech Tips

How to Winterize Your Porsche

Fill your tank with fuel and use a fuel stabilizer.



Now, I know some people will swear that emptying your tank is the way to go. This may be true if you can actually get all the fuel out of your tank and fuel lines. If not, fill the tank up. Use a fuel stabilizer. Preferably one that will stabilize the ethanol in your fuel. Remember to drive your car around for at least 15 minutes after you've added the stabilizer so it can mix with the fuel and enter the fuel lines.

Wash and detail your car You don't want any dirt, bird droppings, errant leaves or other things sticking to the paint for an extended period of time. This also means cleaning the inside of the car. I caution against steam cleaning carpets or upholstery before you store the car unless you give the moisture plenty of time to dry out. Trapped moisture in the interior will inevitably lead to a mold problem. You want to be greeted to a nice, clean car in the spring and not a mold problem.

Cover the exhaust pipes so that mice or other small animals cannot use your cozy muffler as a home. Watch past episodes of Chasing Classic Cars and you'll see many nests that shot out of the exhaust whenever they fire up a car that's been sitting too long. It's also a good idea to block off any inlets to your airbox as this is also a favorite spot for rodents to build a nest. What to use? Steel wool, rags with mothballs, or dryer sheets are well known barriers that mice are not fond of.

Cover your car For cars being stored indoors, this will not only keep dust off the car but should something fall off a shelf, it could help lessen any damage to the top or bodywork. For cars being stored outside, remember to lock your doors, roll your windows up and close sunroofs. Also, use a cover specifically made for outdoors. This means a multi-layer cover. It will also benefit you to have a custom cover for your model. You don't want the cover damaging the paint or the window because it is ill fitting.

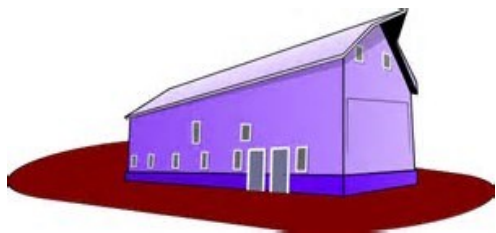
Change your oil and top off your fluids. This means checking and topping off your coolant. If you have a fluid leak that you are putting off until the spring, remember to use a tarp underneath it, or if indoors, a piece of cardboard or something that will prevent your floor from being stained.

Battery tenders There are arguments on whether to disconnect the battery or put it on a battery tender/maintainer when storing it for the winter. I prefer the battery maintainer. Porsche sells its own brand or you can buy a CTeK or Battery Tender, which are both highly rated. There's a lot of complicated electronics in newer Porsches and maintaining the charge on the battery will just make your life easier in the spring.

Remember to over inflate your tires but not beyond the tire manufacturer's recommendations. Put a note in your car to remind yourself to bleed the air out when you bring it out of hibernation. I try to move my car by hand whenever it sits for more than a few weeks so as to reduce flat spotting. I also recommend against using the hand brake. If you are parking it on an incline and are worried about the car rolling, just use a wheel chock or piece of wood.

Leave dryer sheets in the interior. You were advised to use dryer sheets in any openings where a rodent may decide to build a nest. It's also a good idea to leave some in the interior of your car as this will further discourage critters from making your car a winter hideaway.

If you would like to drive your car on a day when the weather is unusually nice and all the salt on the roads have been washed away, remember to reverse all the storage work you've done.
